




Summer International Travel Grants

Born out of the College's commitment to cross-cultural experience, international research, and foreign language learning, the Summer International Travel Grants give you the freedom to design your own summer experience abroad. During the summer, you will travel independently to a location of your choice and carry out original research or study the local language. Funding begins at \$4,000, and each year the College awards approximately 100 grants to support these efforts.

Foreign Language Acquisition Grants

With language grant support, students pursue intermediate or advanced language study in the location and program of their choosing. Programs must be at least eight weeks long and located in a setting where the target language is predominantly spoken. These grants are ideal for students who are seeking an independent immersion experience.

Research Grants

A number of research grants are awarded for students with research projects that necessitate time spent on the ground overseas. In the past, students have conducted independent research in all corners of the world, from field archaeology in Peru to molecular dynamics in Sweden. Often this work leads to a BA paper.
